<b>CHILD WITNESSES</b>	<b>1,200</b>	<b>1,379</b>	<b>777</b> <b>(1,187 on 911 calls)</b>	<b>This is confusing and I don't have an answer. 1,187 child witnesses were reported by individuals making 911 calls, but only 777 were documented in police reports.</b>

<b>INCIDENTS BETWEEN SIBLINGS</b>	<b>85</b>	<b>140</b>	<b>249</b> <b>(125 on 911 calls)</b>	<b>If we lump all non- intimate partners together we have 456 incidents. In other words of the 1,467 DV incident reports, about one third of them occurred between non-intimate partners. This is important. We anticipate that the definition of DV is going to change to include only current or past intimate partners or co-parents of children.</b>

<b>SUICIDE IDEATION</b>	<b>28 (extrapolated based upon 6 month of data)</b>	<b>54</b>	<b>19</b> (47 on 911 calls)	<b>This number is important because there is a strong correlation between threats of suicide and DV related homicide.</b>
<b>MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES</b>	<b>18 (extrapolated based upon 6 month data)</b>	<b>64</b>	<b>46</b> (53 on 911 calls)	<b>Mental health and access to medication continue to be a problem with victims and perpetrators of DV.</b>
<b>STALKING</b>	<b>UK</b>	<b>55</b>	<b>55</b>	<b>I believe this number is very low. Victims of stalking often do not call law enforcement because the crime is so difficult to prove.</b>

<b>ASSAULT</b>			<b>88</b> <b>6% of all incidents</b>	<b>A person can be arrested for this crime.</b>

<b>VERBAL</b>			<b>399</b> <b>27% of all incidents</b>	<b>Almost one third of all incident reports detailed a verbal dispute. Many incidents were associated with money problems.</b>
<b>LBGT</b>	<b>UK</b>	<b>32</b>	<b>20</b> <b>(22 on 911 calls)</b>	<b>Our gay population is still very uncomfortable about calling law enforcement when they have a DV issue.</b>

<b>CHILD ABUSE</b>			<b>26</b>	<b>Just starting to collect this data.</b>
