## Keynote by Rev. Dr. Marie Fortune

Rev. Marie M. Fortune received her seminary training at Yale Divinity School and was ordained a minister in the United Church of Christ in 1976. After serving in a local parish, she founded the Center for the Prevention of Sexual and Domestic Violence, now known as FaithTrust Institute, in 1977 where she served as Executive Director until 1999. Today FaithTrust Institute is a multifaith, multicultural organization providing religious communities and advocates with training, consultation and educational materials to address the faith aspects of abuse. She is also Editor of *The Journal of Religion and Abuse* and served on the National Advisory Council on Violence Against Women for the U.S. Department of Justice and the Defense Task Force on Domestic Violence for the U.S. Department of Defense.



The event will include stories from survivors of violence, training in how to provide safety and resources for victims (Santa Fe Safe Haven Training), faith community action planning, and resource materials for your faith community.
