## **Program Narrative – (Attachment 1)**

This is a joint application from the City and the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico. Santa Fe County, which is home to the City of Santa Fe, covers 2,000 square miles. The population of the county is about 120,000. About 60,000 individuals reside in the city proper. With a very large undocumented population the actual residential number is estimated at 132,000. Numerous commuters work in the area's only large city, causing the population to swell during regular business hours. Santa Fe is also a popular tourist destination, adding to population and problems.

The City of Santa Fe Police Department is requesting \$48,153 in funds to purchase a Rapid Deployment Vehicle (RDT). The purpose of this vehicle is to transport Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team members. As a multi-use vehicle it will be used to accommodate numerous law enforcement situations including "buy busts," warrant collections, crowd control, surveillance and SWAT raids. The exterior of the vehicle is fairly inconspicuous. The interior is roomy enough to accommodate up to 18 heavily geared officers.

The Santa Fe County Sheriffs office is located in northern Santa Fe County. Santa Fe County's 2,000 square miles and are patrolled by three patrol shifts with 6 to 7 deputies per shift. County Sheriffs also provide:

- Security at District Court.
- Prisoner Transport.
- Service of Civil Court and Restraining Orders.
- DWI and Traffic Control.
- Investigations.

When deputies respond to calls for service most of the time they are alone, unless the call is of a violent nature. Thus, the need for Tasers is very high. All deputies carry and are trained in Taser use. Our office purchased the first Tasers approximately 8 years ago. These Tasers are badly worn and are in need of replacing. The Santa Fe County Sheriff's Office requests \$27,428 in funds to replace worn Tasers.

Both City and County Law Enforcement work closely together as need and incident dictates. Thus, though awards and equipment will be purchased by individual agencies, they will be available to serve as back-up should either agency have the need.

**2009 BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM AWARD**

This Agreement is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_day of June, 2009, by and between The COUNTY of Santa Fe, New Mexico, acting by and through its governing body, the County Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and the CITY of Santa Fe, New Mexico, acting by and through its governing body, the City Council, hereinafter referred to as CITY, both of Santa Fe County, State of New Mexico, witnesseth:

**WHEREAS**, this Agreement is made under the authority of Sections \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ Government Code: and

**WHEREAS**, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party: and

**WHEREAS**, each governing body finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this agreement: and

**WHEREAS**, the County agrees to provide the City \$48,153 from the JAG award for the Law Enforcement Program: and

**WHEREAS**, the CITY and COUNTY believe it to be in their best interests to reallocate the JAG funds.

**NOW THEREFORE, the COUNTY and CITY agree as follows:**

**Section 1.**

County agrees to pay City a total of \$48,153 of JAG funds.

**Section 2.**

COUNTY agrees to use \$27,428 for the Sheriff's Office Program until September 30, 2010.

**Section 3.**

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against COUNTY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the \_\_\_\_\_Tort Claims Act.

**Section 4.**

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against CITY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the \_\_\_\_\_Tort Claims Act.

**Section 5.**

Each party to this agreement will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.

**Section 6.**

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

**Section 7.**

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.
